In Bumble Bee class the children will be part of a mixed age class with EYFS and Year 1 pupils accessing all of the classroom areas throughout the day. We also have a secure, sheltered outdoor area which we are able to enjoy all year round.

We offer a safe, caring, stimulating and happy learning environment full of wonder and excitement, where children are given a sense of belonging and develop a love of learning. Learning is fun and practical. Children will have opportunities to work in large and small groups with an adult, as well as being able to access a range of resources independently.

Our School Day





The gate will be open from 8:45am

Learning begins at 9:00am

Children finish at 3:15pm (Full Term Dates are available on our school website)



During the first few days of school we invite you in to help your child find their locker; put their bag away and settle them into an activity. As soon as they are confident with the morning routine, our staff will be there to encourage and support them as they become more independent. Usually once children are confident with coming into school, parents and carers drop them off at the gate into the playground. At the end of the day the children are collected from the playground.

Lunchtime

In EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2, your child's hot lunch is funded as part of the Universal Infant Free School Meal Scheme. School lunches are cooked at another local school and are delivered each day. Your child will be able to choose each morning between a main option, vegetarian option or jacket potato, or alternatively you can send a packed lunch if preferred. If you are in receipt of any means tested benefits, please refer to the additional 'Free School Meals' information.

Snacks and drinks

The children will be given a piece of fruit or vegetable at morning break if they would like one. Milk is available for free for all children under the age of 5 and must be ordered online through the 'Cool Milk' scheme. Details of how to set this up are within this pack. Once your child turns 5, Cool Milk will contact you directly to see if you would like to continue paying for milk.

We also ask that parents provide a named water bottle for school which stays in the classroom and goes home at the end of the day. Please make sure that only water is in the bottle.

School Uniform



Uniform

Your child will need to wear:

- a purple jumper or cardigan
- a white shirt, blouse or polo shirt
- black or grey trousers, skirt or dress
- black, grey or white socks or tights
- sensible black school shoes, no heels or trainers please

Please be aware that jewellery should not be worn other than if children have pierced ears. In this circumstance, studs are allowed.

Nail varnish should not be worn. Hair accessories must be in line with uniform colours. Hair should be tied up.

Your child will also need a:

- bag containing a set of spare clothes to be kept in school in their locker
- pair of wellies, which will be required during forest school sessions
- warm waterproof coat with a hood

PE Kit

Children will need to come into school dressed in their PE kits on their allocated day, this will be communicated nearer the start of term.

Your child will need to wear:

- a black hooded top
- black shorts or joggers
- a white round-necked T shirt
- trainers or black plimsoles

Hair should be tied up and jewellery is not permitted for PE lessons. Please ensure all earrings are removed before school as staff cannot assist with removing these.

Class Dojo Online Learning Platform

If your child attended a nursery or pre-school then you may be familiar with the special learning journal that celebrated your child's learning experiences during their time at the setting.

At Ab Kettleby Primary School we share your child's achievements and progress using our online learning platform called Class Dojo.

You will be able to view and contribute to your child's

portfolio through a QR code that has been sent to you with this pack. You will then be able to freely access all of the lovely photographs and videos showing your child learning through play. The QR code will also allow you to see both the School Story and our Class Story for whole school/class messages and celebrations of achievement. You will also be able to message us using the direct messaging feature. This is how we will organise your home visit. In class we will also use Class Dojo in order to give 'dojos' for achievements. These are transferred to house points and collated throughout the year.



More Information



The School Day

8:45am School begins 10:30-10:45am Break Time 12:00-1:00pm Lunch Time School day ends 3:15pm

Please make sure your child arrives for the start of the school day and you pick them up promptly at 3.15pm. Missing the start of the session can unsettle your child and being late to pick them up can make children anxious.

Our first priority is the safety of your child. At the end of the day staff ensure they can see each child's parent/carer before releasing them. As an extra safeguarding measure, if someone else is to collect your child from school, please tell us in advance, giving us a password that is also known by the person collecting your child.



If and when your child becomes ill, please let the school office know by calling the school phone (01664 504870) or emailing the office by 9am. Please leave a message if it is not answered. If they are sick or have diarrhoea, they will need to be off school for 48 hours from the last bout of illness. If your child becomes unwell when they are in school, we will call you for them to be collected.



Unauthorised Absence

The law states parents do not have the automatic right to take their child out of school for holidays during term time. All schools have received clarification from the Department of Education about children taking holidays during term time. As of September 2013, Headteachers are not able to authorise any holiday requests during school time.

If for any reason you need to take your child out of school during term time then you will need to collect a leave of absence form (at least 2 weeks prior to the date), from the office and return it completed. The Headteacher will then respond to you in writing about your request.



Medicines

We can only give medicines if they are prescribed by a doctor — and we will need written permission to give them. A 'Medicine Request' form must be filled in, which are available from the office.

If your child is asthmatic or carries an EpiPen, they will need an inhaler/ EpiPen in school at all times, so please talk to your doctor about this. Please note that it is parents and carers' responsibility to ensure that all prescribed medicines, including inhalers and Epi Pens are in date and replaced as necessary.



Accidents

If your child has an accident in school they may receive basic first aid. Parents and carers will always receive a phone call about head injuries and an email about other injuries.

Free School Meals (FSM)

Your child may be entitled to Free School Meals (FSM) if you receive certain means-tested benefits.

FSM is different to the Universal free school meals that all children in EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to.


If you are successful in applying for FSM, your child may then become eligible for the Pupil Premium funding (see below). The Pupil Premium money is great for your child, so please do apply for FSM as it's the first step in getting it.



Pupil Premium

The Pupil Premium is extra money which is paid to schools from the government to support children's learning and development. The money could pay for support like small group work to boost progress and subsidising the cost of school trips. Children from EYFS to Year 11 (in secondary school) may be eligible if they are any of the below:

- are or have been in care
- have parents in the armed forces
- are registered for Free School Meals (FSM)
- have been registered for FSM at any point in the last six years



When talking to your child about school and their new teachers, please pass on positive feelings about them starting school, even though you may be feeling anxious yourself.
